

Description: A small, bright green perennial shrub. It appears to grow only up to 40 - 50 cm in height. It has a single smooth, grey-brown woody stem, which branches about 10 cm above the ground. Leaves are small, light green and thick, with a soft velvety surface. The flowers are small and inconspicuous. The sepals open out to form a pointed star, while the deep red petals do not open much, remaining bud-like. They were flowering in July (2001), this could be the time of year they normally flower, or they were flowering following rain in June.

Habitat: Very common in the sand dunes, in interdunal valleys and stabilised dunes. These shrubs often grow indense stands, but may sometimes be seen singly.
