Description: A prostrate creeper, which flowers annually. Compound leaves are composed of 5-10 leaflets (occasionally more). Flowers are bright yellow and small, approximately 1 cm in diameter. Radiating branches may be up to a metre long. The spiny fruit has given it its common name.

Habitat: T. terrestris occurs in all kinds of habitat, being a pioneer it is often found in disturbed ground, particularly places that have been overgrazed or trampled, or roadsides.

General information: *Tribulus terrestsris* can cause a complex disease in sheep, called 'geeldikkop'. There are 6 *Tribulus* species in Namibia. *Tribulus zeyheri* also grows on NamibRand, the most obvious difference being the size of the flowers, which are much larger in the latter species.
